

## “Christmas Traditions Embroidered Scarf”



As the weather turns cold, there is no reason why you can't stay warm if you bundle up with this scarf when going outside. Use this free project to create this stylish scarf with the use of Christmas Traditions Interactive Embroidery snowflake designs and DensityWorks from Designer's Gallery. Then, embroider the scarf with the Ellisimo embroidery machine and join the seams together using the Baby Lock Embellisher.

## Supplies:

Baby Lock® Ellisimo Sewing and Embroidery machine

Baby Lock Embellisher

Baby Lock Serger (Optional)

Christmas Traditions Interactive Embroidery from Designer's Gallery®

DensityWorks from Designer's Gallery

½ Yard charcoal colored fleece


½ Yard snowflake print fleece


Baby Lock® Dissolve-Away Mesh Self-Adhesive stabilizer


White embroidery thread

## Instructions

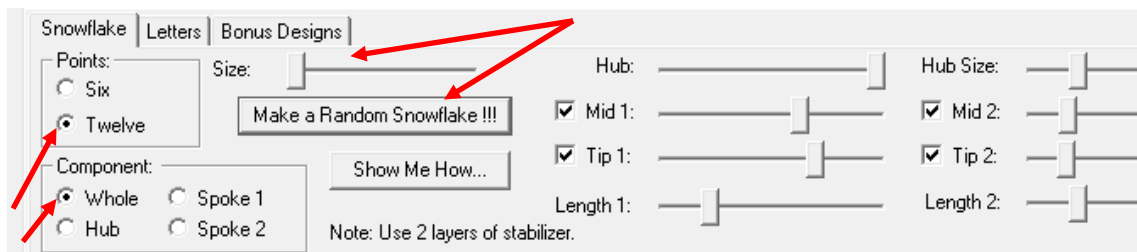
### At the Computer:

1. Open the program by clicking on the Interactive  icon on the desktop.

2. On the top toolbar click on the Interactive  icon.

3. On the Left toolbar scroll down and select  CT1 Christmas Designs. If you have more than one program installed, the programs will be listed in alphabetic order.

4. Click on the Snowflake tab and adjust the settings according to the following steps:
  - Under Points, select Twelve.
  - Select Whole under the Component field.
  - Slide the Size control all the way to the left.
  - Click on Make a Random Snowflake. **Note:** with each additional click on this control a different snowflake will be displayed. There are thousands of snowflake possibilities. So, continue to click until you find a snowflake that you like.

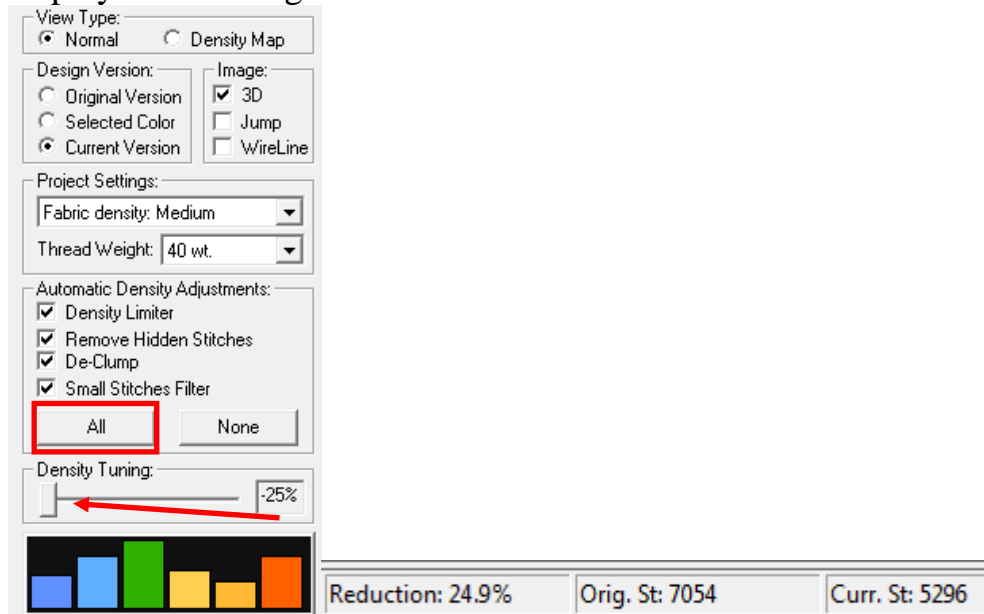


5. Click on Save and save as a .pes file to the media device that your embroidery machine will read.

6. The snowflake design in Christmas Traditions was created for stand-alone lace; density in the design will need to be adjusted. Open DensityWorks from Designer's Gallery and follow the next set of directions:



- Click on the Open icon on the top toolbar.
- Under the Automatic Density Adjustments, click on All
- Slide the Density Tuning all the way to the left. The density has been reduced approximately 2000 stitches. The stitch count is displayed on the right side of the Status bar.



7. Click on Save and save as a .pes file to the media device that your embroidery machine will read.

### At The Cutting Table:

1. From the charcoal gray fleece, cut across the width of the fabric a section that is 12" x 30".
2. Cut two additional pieces from the charcoal gray that measure 12" x 6" for the fringe.
3. From the snowflake print, cut out two pieces that measure 12" x 10".

### At the Embellisher Machine:

1. Determine the front sides of each fabric section.
2. Overlap the 12" x 30" charcoal gray ends 1/2" over the ends on the 12" x 10" snowflake sections. Pin the sections in place.
3. With the machine on and all of the needles in place, place one end of the overlapped section under the needles and lower the presser foot. Remove the pins and embellish over the overlapped area until the snowflake section is completely attached to the charcoal gray section.

The fibers from the charcoal gray area are pushed into the snowflake fabric messing the two together. Repeat for the opposite end.

4. Place the 12" x 6" charcoal gray section to the end of each of the snowflake print ends and overlap the gray section ½" over the snowflake print and embellish the two together. Repeat for the opposite end.



#### **At the Embroidery Machine:**

1. Hoop the stabilizer in the 100mm x 100mm hoop. Remove the top layer from the stabilizer by poking the stabilizer with a stick pin, then carefully lift the layer and tear away from the hoop.
2. On each end of the scarf there will be four embroidered snowflake designs. Place Positioning Sticker over the seam line approximately 3½" from the edge, overlapping it over the first seam line.
3. Place the scarf in the hoop, centering the sticker in the hoop.
4. With the embroidery machine on, retrieve the design in the Embroidery Edit mode.
5. Place the hoop on the machine.
6. Click on the Positioning Sticker icon in the sewing field. This will center and rotate the design in the machine.
7. Remove the Positioning Sticker.
8. Embroider the design using white embroidery thread.
9. Repeat these steps until all of the designs have been embroidered.
10. Cut away the stabilizer close to the embroidery designs. The remaining stabilizer can be removed by gently washing it away in the washing machine.

### **Finishing the Scarf:**

1. Finish the sides of the scarf using either a rolled edge or set the sewing machine up using a zig-zag stitch.
2. Cut 5½" long slits ½" apart on each end to create a fringe.
